

I am and have used a Word Wall (although I call it a Word Window) strategy as attached on the picture in my current unit on American Imperialism. They are laminated and hot-glued onto the window, students have commented how nice it is to have the terminology "hanging over their heads" during the entire unit as a reminder of the vocabulary utilized. We also make sure to pronounce each term as a class, when we encounter that word as it coincides with direct instruction or indirect conversation. The notes I provide for each student are in PDF form and have the terms highlighted and defined for them.

I will also use the "Wows, Wonders and What Ifs" strategy but I call it See, Think, Wonder as attached for Progressive Movements. This generates great conversation in class!
